Grades: K-2



Safe@Home courses Grades: 4 - 6 2 classes offered! **Fee:** \$20.00

Safe@Home by Safe Sitter® is a program designed for students in grades 4-6 to prepare them to be safe and care for themselves when their parents are away for short periods of time. This is a instructor facilitated program that teaches students how to practice safe habits, prevent unsafe situations, and what to do when faced with dangers such as power failures or weather emergencies. Students are also introduced to the Safe Sitter® First Aid Chart and learn a system to help them assess and respond to injuries and illnesses. (\$20.00 fee includes a student handbook & a gift bag)

Students in grades 6-8 that are interested in learning how to care for younger children should complete one of the SafeSitter babysitting courses. The SafeSitter course is currently being offered through the Cheshire Park & Recreation Department several times throughout the school year.




